AED - defibrillator: Attached to the outside corner of Ruma Horoeka is an AED defibrillator. Our School and Parish saw the need to have one available incase of an emergency in or around our community. The AED is in a locked box. In an emergency when it is required, all you have to do is phone 111, state where you are, and they will give you the code to unlock the box. The simple instructions are on the defibrillator showing how to operate it, as well as voice instructions. The 111 operator will also talk you through the process of the emergency. The main thing is that you know it is there!
