Assumption of Mary 15th August

The assumption of Mary – New Zealand's Patron Saint (Holy Day of Obligation).



What is a Holy Day of obligation? The obligation to participate in the Mass. The obligation to refrain from engaging in work or activities that hinder the worship owed to God.

In New Zealand, we now have only two of these additional holy days of obligation apart from Sunday. They are Christmas Day and the feast of the Assumption, August 15. Mary's assumption into heaven is also the patronal feast of the Catholic people in New Zealand. Having now only two of these additional holy days of obligation might be added reason to celebrate them well. Consequently, from now on they are holy days of obligation whenever they fall, including Saturdays and Mondays.

We will be attending Mass as a whole school next week on Thursday. **Please note the time has changed to 10am.** There will be some Sacred Heart girls attending mass with us. Please join us if you

2019 International Competition and Assessments for Schools (ICAS): are at SJB again this year. Your child is invited to participate in ICAS 2019. This competition provides an opportunity for students to gain a measure of their own achievements in external testing situation. ICAS is designed to target students' higher-order thinking and problem-solving . skills in English, Mathematics, Science, Writing, Spelling and Digital Technologies. ICAS Assessments are now online, a move that reflects a sector-wide transition to computerbased assessment. This allows greater accessibility for students and faster delivery of results. Each assessment celebrates students' accomplishments by providing opportunities for recognition. Every student will receive a certificate and an online result report. Students are eligible for awards including High Distinction, Distinction, Credit, Merit and Participation certificates. Top performers will be eligible for medals and are invited to attend special award ceremonies to have their academic excellence publicly recognised. If you wish your child to enter any of these competitions then please complete the entry slip below and return to the office with your payment. Please note: The ICAS competitions are optional for all students from years 4-6.
