We feel strongly that 5th November is an ideal time to raise the profile of the peaceful resistance to invasion that occurred at Parihaka on 5 November 1881 and enact the values of two great leaders of the past within our community. These values and actions also fit so beautifully with our very own catholic faith and pastoral care. I really encourage you to read and research more about the story of Parihaka.

Thank you for your support in our Parihaka Day Commemorations this year. We were humbled by the koha received for our Hangi and felt highly supported through the turnout to our shared hangi meal.

A special thank you to all the parents who helped prepare our hangi food. Thank you also to the dads that gave their day to cook our hangi absolutely delicious! Thanks also to our whanau who helped us over the two day period during our rotation activities. Our tamariki had a lot of fun, learnt a lot and are growing in their awareness of historical events that shape the lives of people around us.
