We are an advocate of the NPDC "Lets Go" campaign which encourages students to walk, bike or scooter into school. We really want to continue to encourage this positive active skill of coming to school. We have also provided bike safety and scooter safety courses for all students over the years and will again hopefully in 2020. But I do ask you to please take time to talk to your child / children about...

- · footpath safety and keeping focused on what's happening around you.
- assume there may be a car coming out of or into the driveway.
- · check helmets and ensure helmets are fitted correctly and done up.
- If they notice someone being dangerous or silly to let their class teacher know.

Parents who drive to school please consider that many students do walk, scooter or bike to school. We need you to...

- reduce your speed in and around school.
- park in painted car park areas and not on roadside verges.
- · avoid dropping kids in our cauldersack marked with yellow no parking / stopping paint.
- If turning into a driveway watch out for children using footpaths.

We really do appreciate our school families' efforts to park and walk into school and out of school. It certainly helps keep safe and calm.

**On Thursday the 26th March** the Year 5 and 6 students will be visiting Muru Raupatu Marae for an overnight stay. We will be leaving at 9.15 am and going by car. (More information for seniors will come home soon).

**On Friday the 27th March** the rest of our school will join our Year 5 and 6 students at the Marae for the day. We will be leaving school by bus **1** at 9.00 am and return by 3.00 pm. Children will be required to return to school by bus, with their teacher.

# All whanau/family are welcome to come along with us - but you will need to provide your own transport.

### HELP WANTED:

We are looking for whanau and friends who are interested in helping when we visit the Marae. It could be helping us with the organisation of the day e.g. in the kitchen, the Powhiri, Poroporoake or with one of our activities for example; Tukutuku, Whakairo, Te Koruru, Titi Torea, Waiata, Story Telling and more! ### We will be having a shared morning tea. A sausage sizzle will be provided for lunch. If your child has any special dietary requirements they can bring their own morning tea and lunch.

### COST:

### Year 5 and 6 - 20.00 - covers kai (food), koha/donation. Rest of School Year 0 - 4: 2.00 covers Sausage lunch and the koha/donation. (to be paid to class teacher in a named envelope)

We will be arriving at the Marae by 9.30 am. If you are meeting us there please park either along the road or up the drive away (someone will direct you). We will all meet together at the beginning of the drive way. **Do not enter the Marae grounds** as we will be officially welcomed by the Tangata whenua. Women please wear a long skirt / tights or if you are wearing pants you will need a blanket or sarong type of cloth to cover your legs for the powhiri. **If you are coming to Muru Raupatu Marae it is important that you will be there for the powhiri as you need to be welcomed onto the Marae before visiting.** The children are all learning about Marae protocol, ask your child/children about what will happen during the powhiri and the visit. **Please be aware you may take photographs of the children BUT it is important that you do not take photographs of the carvings, tukutuku or kowhaiwhai.**



1. Go to the **App store** on your android or Apple Device.

2. Search for  $\ensuremath{\textbf{SchoolAppsNZ}}$ 

3. Download the App.

4. Once App has been downloaded, search for St John Bosco

4. When opening it will ask which **groups** you would like to belong to.

Once you have selected the groups you'd like to belong to any notes or alerts sent from each of these groups will appear on your App as an Alert.

This is a quick and easy way of finding out what is happening at school. We have also loaded events on the calendar and all contacts are there also.



Enrol your children with the walking school bus. Their name will go onto a register and they will be escorted to meet you on the other side of the school crossing on Paynter's Av. We want to reduce the dangerous and busy car traffic that the end of a day brings to a school environment. Please see your teacher if you want to join up.
