We've had another great week back at school. Our children continue to be settled and settling back into school life incredibly well. Kids are walking happily into and out of school independently. The entire school environment is calm and as a part of this we are empowering the children to be in control.

We would like this routine to continue for a number of reasons. It is firstly abiding by our level 2 rules and secondly our teachers are experiencing and observing our children being more independently organised, calmer and actually really settled in their start to the day.

This term we will focus on reporting to you in relation to your child's writing and their learning habits. Our traditional mid year interviews will not be held this term, however we are planning for this to occur in early Term 3.

The Easter Season is coming to an end

The story of Easter didn't end on Easter Sunday. Two other important parts of the story are told and celebrated several weeks later. Ascension Day is celebrated on the 7th Sunday of Easter (which was last Sunday). On that day people remember how Jesus returned to his father in heaven. A week later the coming of the Holy Spirit is celebrated on Pentecost Sunday (which is this Sunday 31st May).

The Ascension of the Lord. Jesus goes to heaven

The story of Jesus' return to his Father is told in the book of the Acts of the Apostles written by St Luke. St Luke says that as Jesus was lifted up, a cloud hid him from sight. Writers of the Bible sometimes used the idea of a cloud to show that God was present. In his story of the Ascension, St Luke wanted to show that Jesus was going from this world into the presence of God his Father.

So people celebrate the Ascension of Jesus as part of the good news of Easter - Jesus is alive, Jesus is with God and with us forever. The Ascension is a day of great joy!

Jesus said to his friends one day, "Very soon I must go away. Don't be sad because I will come back again!"

"Tell my story everywhere." And then as his beloved friends were standing there Jesus went up, up, up into the sky!



Pentecost Sunday - The Birthday of the Church

Before he returned to his Father in Heaven, the risen Jesus visited his disciples and promised to send the Holy Spirit to help them. We read in Scripture that one morning, when the disciples were gathered together with Mary, the mother of Jesus, and some other women, they suddenly heard a noise like a strong wind. Then they saw what looked to be flames of fire over each of them. "And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit."

The Holy Spirit filled the disciples with courage and faith, empowering them to share the Good News with others. They began to tell others about Jesus, and that he died for us and rose to new life. On this day the gift of the Spirit allowed the disciples to communicate even with those who spoke different languages.



We often call this the birthday of the Church because this was when the Holy Spirit was sent to reassure and encourage Jesus' people to not be afraid to carry on and share his good news!

The Holy Spirit continues to be with us always!

The University of Canterbury is offering your child the opportunity to participate in the KIWI English, Mathematics and Science competitions. These competitions take place annually and are designed by New Zealand teachers for New Zealand students based on the New Zealand Curriculum. The competitions are open to all Year 5-10 students in English, Mathematics and Science. Students can enter in one or more subjects. This year the competition will provide parents with an Individual Pupil Report of a student's performance. The supervised online tests will take place in the first 3 weeks of Term 3.

All participating students will receive a certificate and prizes will be awarded to top students.

NOTE: Our policy is **not** to release test papers. The tests are provided primarily as a competition and not as a teaching resource.

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
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
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
