From the Principals Desk...

Last week on Friday I had the opportunity to spend the day with Room Rimu in their Let's Go Bike Skill and Safety Programme. It was great to be back in a class and working alongside students in an authentic context. I often spend time in classes and witness the programmes they take part in but to be able to spend the day was so rewarding. The bike skills programme is superb. The range of skills the children developed and were exposed to was amazing. I learnt a whole lot myself! I loved watching their initial nervous actions transform into well considered reactions in relation to what was happening on the road at the time for the children. The highlight was the Bike Ride around our Village and along the walkway at the end of the day as a class. I know the staff were making bets on which muscle I might pull, or could I pull off the bike ride and would I last the day. Let's just say I won!

The weather patterns have changed these last weeks. We are still encouraging our children to be active outside during breaks when weather permits. Our PE classes are also ensuring the kids are keeping active either through ball skills sessions, tai Bo workouts etc.

Term Two Competency: This term our New Zealand Curriculum focus has been based on Relating to others. Our key teachings in this area have been based on the following key ideas we value at St John Bosco School.Listen and look at the speaker / listen to and value others' ideas / use active listening skills (acknowledge speaker, paraphrase, reflect before responding). Include everyone when working in small groups / work with all ages / work cooperatively with others / accept others within the group and value their contributions / help and support others / respect the right of others to learn without interruption.
