From the Principals Desk...

Welcome back: We've had a great week one back at school. Like always it has been so nice reconnecting with the children and also families. I do feel fortunate to see settled, rested and happy kids in classes each day.

This term sees us within reason returning to most of our pre covid routines and expectations. We will be maintaining hygiene practices at school in relation to sanitising work spaces daily and hand cleaning in some parts of the day. The hygiene lessons learnt in the past few months I am hoping will lead to reduced illnesses and spread of bugs.

Last term disruptions have meant that we haven't in some cases been able, due to restrictions, follow some of our normal routines. Examples of this are reporting in some areas, learning conferences and school assemblies. There will be many questions and wonderings about what impact shorter periods of face to face learning contact has had on schools and children.

What I need you to do is trust me ... We have a plan to get us back on track in relation to reporting, sharing information, celebrating special occasions and also ensuring educational needs are being met. Mrs Haveswood Maternity Leave: You will be aware that Bethany will be taking maternity leave later this term. We have been very lucky to negotiate with Mrs Katie Smith and Mrs Helen Baldwin a job share role in Kawakawa for the remainder of the year. This will allow our planned and deliberate junior school teaching routines to continue with ease for Kawakawa. It was also great this week to have both Katie and Helen onsite connecting with families and children in order to ensure relationships and routines are created and maintained.

Mid Year Learning Conferences: Bookings are now open for parent/ student/teacher learning conferences scheduled for Wednesday 29th and Thursday 30th July. As you are aware these conferences were delayed due to Covid disruptions last term. We will be following the exact same processes we have in previous years.
