Safety at School Gate: I am again starting to notice children being dropped off and collected from the cauldersack at our school entrance. # SJB CROSS COUNTRY Tuesday 1st September – at St John Bosco

Dear Parents. Our Annual cross country is just around the corner. Ms Lynskey has had the children training hard with her great variety of activities during PE lessons. Like all other years, our main focus is 100% participation. Our focus is to see every child cross the line with a great big smile saying "I did the cross country in 2020!"

We received great feedback from parents about holding the cross country at school so we will do the same again. Children will run the course in the days prior to the event to ensure they know what to do on the day.

Below are the main details for the day. We can not give specific times as it is just too hard to determine how long each race will take. Most take about 10 minutes. But we do actively encourage you all to join us for the entire event.

12:00 Special Character Leaders to say an Opening Prayer.

#### 12.10pm

First Race (Age on the day)
