From the Principals Desk...

Covid: We have moved back to School Care programme will I know that our street gets busy prior Covid 19 Level 2 Restrictions on midday Wednesday. This will currently be in place at this stage from until midnight on Friday. (We will keep the community informed on any further developments).

Covid Safety Plan.

What does this mean for St John Bosco?

- · We will continue our hand washing protocols on arrival to school and sanitising throughout the day.
- · All common area surfaces will be sanitised daily.
- We will be reinforcing coughing and sneezing into the cuff of elbows.
- We ask that children who are sick or showing symptoms please stay We will also be asking home. children to be collected if they become unwell at school.
- · We ask that students are not onsite prior to 8:15a.m. This is to allow us to clean surfaces.

· We are asking families not to enter school grounds and encouraging families to drop and collect children at one of our three main entrances (Walkway gate, Front entrance on Clinton Street or through our courtyard gate), only visit classes if essential or children require support 4. Read the policy. to transition to school.

- · Parents who come on site must log in via the school app, paper tracing registers in classrooms or through the Covid19 QR code at our main entrances.
- · Parents must enforce social distancing of 1-2m while waiting to 9. If you don't have internet access, drop or collect children.
- Social gatherings of 100 or more will be postponed or cancelled.

Drinking fountains are closed, so children will need to bring a named drink bottle each day. We ask that families leave school grounds soon after school finishing for the day. Our inter school games at this stage will be postponed under Alert Level 2 due to restrictions being applied in relation to social gatherings not exceeding 100. We are awaiting advice from organised sports such as netball, hockey etc as to what their plans are and as soon as we get this we are sharing with coaches. Our After

Teacher Only Day: As a part of the teachers collective agreement the Government has allocated all schools in New Zealand 8 teacher only days to be scheduled over the next three years. The purpose of these days is to allow primary school teachers the opportunity to

- refresh and deepen their knowledge and practice around the local curriculum (within the context of the removal of national standards)
- Strengthen their understanding of the use of assessment tools for learning and teaching
- · Respond to the recommendations of the education work programme in the Curriculum, Progress and Achievement (CPA) Report
- · Familiarise themselves with curriculum work changes that will become available over the term of the collective agreements.

We have a Teacher Only Day Scheduled for Friday 4th September. School will be closed for the day to allow all staff to take part in professional development.

Early Arrival at School: We are noticing large numbers of children arriving at school incredibly early in the morning. Staff need space and time to prepare for the day and are not available to supervise children fully until 8:30a.m. We do have bus children that arrive at 8:15a m but we have an arranged plan for these children.

Saturday - 15th August Assumption of Mary

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The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary: This day celebrates the mystery that the Virgin Mary was taken into heaven body and soul. This was declared a doctrine of faith by Pope Pius XII in 1950. Mary's assumption into heaven is also the patronal feast of the Catholic people in New Zealand. In other words, she is the Patron saint of New Zealand and this week is her feast day.

In the Catholic Church, holy days of obligation are days on which the faithful are expected to attend Mass, and engage in rest from work and recreation, according to the Third Commandment. The Church describes Sunday as the 'foremost holy day of obligation' (Catechism of the Catholic Church, n 2177). Other 'holy days of obligation' have always been added to the Sundays. In New Zealand, we only have two of these additional holy days of obligation – Christmas Day and the feast of the Assumption, August 15.

Let us contemplate the words of Pope Francis:

"Mary lived the Beatitudes of Jesus as none other. She is that woman who rejoiced in the presence of God, who treasured everything in her heart, and who let herself be pierced by the sword. Mary is the saint among the saints, blessed above all others. She teaches us the way of holiness and she walks ever at our side. She does not let us remain fallen and at times she takes us into her arms without judging us. This is the Mary we honour today, teaching 'us the way of holiness' and walking 'ever at our side.' Mary our Mother does not need a flood of words. She does not need us to tell her what is happening in our lives. All we need do is whisper, time and time again: "Hail Mary..."

11:45 Children gather on the court


12:00 Special Character Leaders to say an Opening Prayer.

- At the end of each race, the top five runners will be given a number on their hand and are to go to gazebo to record their names.
- Teachers will, from the top five runners for the 9, 10 & 11 year races, decide who will then compete in the New Plymouth Cross Country on the 8th September. We sometimes select our top 8 year old runners to run in the 9 year old race. (Top 12 runners from the NP cross country each event will compete in Hawera on 23rd Sept)
