Last Day of School 2020: With the dynamics of Covid19 and school being closed and holidays brought forward I can now confirm that school will finish for St John Bosco School Students on Friday 11th December. This will be earlier than many other schools as we started back on 29th January, not the 3rd of February like many others did.

Start Date 2021: Our start date in 2021 is looking like it will be the

Wednesday 3rd of February. This is vet to be confirmed by the Board of Trustees, so it is just a chance to indicate to our community roughly our plans. You may ask why there is variation between starting dates and finishing dates each year? Simply the Minister and Ministry of Education determine how many half days a school will be open for instruction. This can range between 380 - 388 half days per year. We are also given a range of dates to begin our school vear. In 2020 it was between 27th January - 7th February. In 2021 it is between 1st February - 9th February.

Teacher Only Day: As mentioned earlier as a part of the recent Teachers Collective Agreement, Teachers have been allocated 8 Teacher only days to be used over the next three years. We have our second Teacher Only Day Scheduled for Tuesday 27th October. School will be closed for the day to allow all staff to take part in professional development onsite.

Year 6 Camp: This week Mr Fleming, Mrs Smith and all Year 6 students are out at Vertical Horizons taking part in our Education outside the classroom camp. The children will be busy kayaking, doing high rope courses, taking part in archery, orienteering and many other fun activities. I'm looking forward to joining them on Thursday and sharing in some of the fun.

Summer Sports: It's great to see so many of our children involved in organised sport this term. Thank you for supporting your children to take part and have an opportunity to be involved in a team. Also thanks so much to our parents who have volunteered to coach these teams.

Please support and help our coaches where you can, little bits of support or help mean a lot to a coach. Please reinforce with your children that the games the children are involved in are a team sport. This means they need to look after all members of the team, make sure everyone is included and has a fair chance to learn and be involved. It's

also a great opportunity for parents to model to children the importance of teams improving, having fun and how good sportsmanship leads to enjoyment and people maintaining their dignity.

Summer Uniform: Term 4 is our Summer Uniform term. We do generally allow a little bit of time for children to transition from shoes to sandals especially while it can still be a little chilly. However sunhats will need to be out and worn starting this week. We will begin to enforce our no hat no play rules very soon as this week some of us were caught out by the sun... This invitation challenges both the Church and humanity as a whole. Like the disciples in the Gospel we were caught off guard by an unexpected, turbulent storm. We have realised that we are on the same boat, all of us called to row together, that only together can we do this.

Through pain and death, we experience our human frailty, but at the same time these things remind us of our deep desire for life and liberation from evil. The call to mission, the invitation to step out of ourselves for love of God and neighbour, presents itself as an opportunity for sharing, service and intercessory prayer. The mission that God entrusts to each one of us leads us away from fear and introspection, to a renewed realisation that we find our true selves when we give ourselves to others."

May the Most Blessed Vírgín Mary contínue to intercede for us and sustain us.
