Class Swap for 2021: Each year we allow students the opportunity to spend some time with their allocated teacher for the following year and begin to build relationships. This will take place on Tuesday 8th December. Many hours are devoted to class placement. Our classes in no way are based on academic ability. Rather our professional knowledge of what is best for your child. Parents will be informed via an

email following on from this and will be given information regarding class placement and stationery for 2021.

SJB Triathlon 2020 - Kia Ora Koutou

Our school triathlon is approaching fast! Lots of fantastic fundraising took place at the beginning of this term so now it is time to complete the event to be rewarded with the chosen prizes. These prizes will be given out in the week following the triathlon.

This triathlon is not a race! The aim for the triathletes is to feel the satisfaction of achievement when they complete their course in their own time, and to have fun! There will be staggered starts (5-6 people) so that there are not too many people in the swimming pool at one time.

The triathlon is on **Friday 4th December**. The event will begin at 9:30am and go through to approximately 2:00pm. **A list of approximate times will be sent home via the school app, to allow you a chance to come and watch.** We will do our best to stick close to these times but can not guarantee this.

Please ensure that your child comes to school already **dressed for their triathlon in their togs with a t-shirt** to put on after the swim leg. As well as bringing a change of clothes and towel for after their race. Their **bikes, helmets and suitable footwear** will need to be at school **before 9:30am**. (Helmets and shoes must be worn). You are most welcome to leave the bikes at school the night before to save the rush in the morning. Let your teacher know if you are doing this to ensure that they get locked up overnight.

When at school, the students will be given a race number to pin onto their tops and a race number to attach to their bikes. Please collect these from your child's teacher. The bikes are then to be walked to the transition area (top of the field). No riding around the school grounds during this time will be permitted due to safety reasons. If you are parking to drop off bikes, please consider parking on Paynters Ave or Darnell St, and walking the bikes in to stop congestion around the church car park area.

If the weather is not looking good on the day, a decision will be made at 8:15am and notification will be posted on our school app.

As the children finish their triathlon, they will receive a free ice block kindly provided by the SJB Community Group. The children will also pick up their pre-purchased sausage at the finish line. **Order forms have been sent home today.** Adults can either pre purchase sausages with their child or can buy directly from the bbg area.

Advent Wreath Blessing

Last night our Special Character Leaders, Hailey and Alejandro, took our school Advent Wreath to the special Advent Wreath Blessing at St Joseph's church. Both students have been incredibly committed to their role and in their responsibilities as Special Character leaders this year. Thank you both for your service.



The first week of Advent begins this Sunday.

Advent Wreaths are often found not only in people's homes but also in the church. This circular evergreen wreath usually contains 4 candles (3 purple and one rose) and each of these candles represents one of the Sundays of Advent. Families who have this wreath in the home will light the candles on each Sunday and say prayers together. It is believed that this tradition goes back to Lutherans in Germany during the 16th century. Sometimes this wreath is known as an Advent Crown.

The Circle of the wreath represents God's everlasting love for us, there is no beginning or end to His love. The evergreen leaves are a symbol of God's promise of everlasting life.

On Christmas Day, a white candle is put into the centre of the wreath. It is called the 'Christ Candle'. It is put into the centre to remind us that Christ should be at the centre of all that we do, especially


