break. Later in the year we will celebrate St John Bosco's birthday on the 16th August. As our Patron Saint I think it's timely to share a little information relating to John Bosco in order to keep his mission close to our hearts...

Saint John Bosco was a man who devoted his life to young people. Born in Italy on the 16th August 1815. He is known as being the Patron Saint of Boys. At the age of 26 he became a Catholic priest and spent his life in homes and schools he built for his boys. He started a religious family, called the Salesians, to continue his work. In 1863 he built a church in Turin to honour "Our Lady Help of Christians" (The name of our church here at St John Bosco School). He is honored all over the world as a saint. We are proud to be the only St John Bosco School here in New Zealand but are proud to know that there are other schools around the world built to continue his mission and faith.

Ash Wednesday: Today we held our annual ash burning ceremony at school. The ceremony is the way in which we prepare the children for the celebration of Ash Wednesday. Mrs Mehana had carefully stored away any palms that staff or families received on Palm Sunday last year. These palms are then carefully burnt and prepared to be used as the ash we will receive on our foreheads during Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday symbolises a time that we begin to prepare for Lent. The burning of ashes symbolises a new beginning. The receiving of ashes are a symbol of our friendship and connection to and with Jesus. Lent is the time when we reflect on how we can become closer to God by thinking of others before ourselves.

The whole school will be attending Ash Wednesday Mass at Our Lady Help of Christians next week 17th February at 9:10am. We also extend an invitation to our school families to come along and join us.

Swimming: Our school pool is looking great and is quite warm! Children will be swimming everyday (weather permitting). Our Aquatics focus is largely on water safety and we strongly encourage all children to take part. As you are aware, wherever you are, in Aotearoa water is normally close by.
