Reporting of Results

Results are provided to schools in Term 3.

Results are reported separately for each competition. Individual student reports are provided for Parents/Caregivers. Student reports outline student's performance overall and for each section including their level of completion and accuracy. Results include a Participated, Achieved, Merit, Excellence and Distinction score with which students and teachers are familiar

The school report file (school use only) includes an overall percentage, percentage scores for different strands of the various curricula, stanine, descriptive grade for each student, the average and 50th percentile for the national group for each competition. A summary of the national statistics for all competitions.

A certificate is provided for all participating students and a prize will be awarded to the top student in each competition.

When will the competition be run?

The on-line competitions will be run in the last three weeks of Term 2 and the first week of Term 3, at a time suitable to the school. Different classes or groups can participate in the competition at different times during this period to give school flexibility in running the competition.

The cost per student for each competition is \$9.50 (inc GST).

These competitions take place annually and are designed by New Zealand teachers for New Zealand students based on the New Zealand Curriculum. The competitions are open to all Year 5-10 students in English, Mathematics and Science. Students can enter in one or more subjects. The competition will provide parents/caregivers with an Individual Pupil Report of a student's performance. The supervised online tests will take place in the last 3 weeks of Term 2 and the first week of Term 3.

All participating students will receive a certificate and a prize will be awarded to the top student nationally in each competition.

NOTE: Our policy is **not** to release test papers. The tests are provided primarily as a competition and not as a teaching resource.


Mothers Day 9h May - A prayer for Mothers:
