What is Trinity Sunday?

Trinity Sunday is the first Sunday after Pentecost in the Christian liturgical calendar. Trinity Sunday celebrates the Christian doctrine of the Trinity, the three Persons of God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.



We are now in **Ordinary Time**. The days in the Church calendar that are not included in the **Trinity Sunday** Seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent or Easter are called Ordinary Time. However, there is nothing

ordinary about this time. Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" not because it is common but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. The Latin word *ordinalis*, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word *ordo*, from which we get the English word *order*. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church.

It is a time for all disciples of Jesus to do ordinary things in the name of Jesus. For Catholics, Ordinary Time is the part of the year in which Christ, the Lamb of God, walks among us and transforms our lives. There's nothing "ordinary" about that! Ordinary Time allows us some space to think about our personal call to follow Jesus and how we are living this out in our 'ordinary' lives. The Liturgical colour on our prayer mats during Ordinary Time is **Green**.



<u>The Mass</u>

In the last few weeks our faith facts have introduced us to the Mass. When the priest and other ministers enter the **sanctuary** they bow to the altar. They **reverence** the **altar** by bowing because the altar is a symbol of Christ himself. We are here to reverence and show respect for Christ's presence. Next you will see the priest kiss the altar. Then the priest says the words of the **Sign of the Cross** and we do it too and finish by saying **Amen**. This gesture of signing is our way of saying we belong to God. It also reminds us that Jesus died on the cross for us.

School and Class Mass

Attending Mass is important for supporting the RE program in classrooms. We invite and strongly encourage whanau to attend these Masses where possible.

This term **School Mass is on Sunday 30th May at 10:30am.** We encourage all families to make the commitment to attend school Mass. It is important that we gather as a community and support our children's faith development.
