We begin this term learning in the

Sacrament Strand. Our overarching statement is: I am called to be like Jesus through my words and my actions. I see the Sacramentality of God in people and in all things.

Theological Facts about the Sacrament Strand

- A sacrament is a *visible sign* of a hidden reality of salvation.
- Jesus is the greatest sign of God's saving action so Christ is a Sacrament of God.
- The Church is a sacrament/sign of Christ. (The people of God/the church continue his work giving glory to God, teaching, healing & saving.)
- The **seven sacraments** are the signs and instruments by which the Holy Spirit spreads the grace of Christ (the head) throughout the Church (it's body).
- The Seven Sacraments are the most important but are not the only signs of God. Many things may act as a sign or sacrament of God.
- The awareness of God being revealed in many ways is referred to as **Sacramentality.** Thus we can be aware of the tapu/sacredness of each person made in God's image.

Take a walk with your child and help them to encounter God in the Sacramentality of nature and all of God's creations. "The Sacraments are the manifestation of the Father's tenderness and love towards each of us."




Grandparents Day

<u>The Mass</u>

Our Faith Facts this term will continue to explain the significant parts of the

Mass. Last term we finished with the **presentation of the gifts** also known as the **Offertory Procession**. This begins the **Liturgy of the Eucharist** part of the Mass.

Once the gifts of bread and wine have been presented and received by the priest, he will bow toward the altar and say an inaudible prayer. This is called the **Prayer over the Offerings.** There are various moments when the priest says inaudible prayers during the Mass. On this occasion he says, "With humble spirit and contrite heart may we be accepted by you, O Lord, and may our sacrifice in your sight

this day be pleasing to you, Lord God." It is an important moment because it manifests that when the priest celebrates the Mass, he is praying, not just repeating mechanical gestures, but rather he is speaking with God.


