School improvement funding: Two years ago the Ministry of extra funding to all State Schools in New Zealand to bring forward

an Essential Property project. At the end of last term it was confirmed that the Ministry of Education would also provide this funding for all State Integrated Schools in New Zealand. Meaning that we too can now look at bringing forward a school property project. I have a few very exciting concepts that I am currently working through with our Board of Trustees. Unfortunately Lockdown has slowed us down, as Auckland based companies haven't been able to price our plans. I am hoping that we will be in a position to share our plans soon.

This is a wonderful achievement and the beauty of our network of Catholic schools is that they came about as the result of the hard work, and generous contributions of many religious and lay people in Catholic parishes and communities across the country. This continues to be the case today with our parish continuing to be a major force behind our being. Our Catholic schools today continue to be the outward sign of a long commitment from both the Church and parents of Catholic children in "helping form Christ in the lives of others". Catholic Schools Day 2021 will once again provide us with another wonderful opportunity to reflect on, give thanks for and in a Level 2 way celebrate our identity as a place of faith based education.

The theme of Catholic Schools Day 2021 is Tūrangawaewae: Catholic Schools - A Place to Stand. We also hope that Catholic Schools Day 2021 will Education provided a pool of be a time of aroha and hope for the future.

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As a school we will celebrate the day by holding a Gold Coin Mufti day for our local Mellow Puff Trust. In our classes and teams we will continue to focus on Social Justice and the Beatitudes of what it means to be and live a Catholic faith filled life and to follow the teaching of Jesus.

Catholic Schools in Aotearoa: A History

1841

Aotearoa New Zealand's first Catholic school was opened by lay people in Auckland in 1841.



1850

The Bishops sought members of Religious congregations to establish achoels throughout Anteriors New Zealand. First to respond were the Sisters of Mercy, arriving in 1850. Other orders followed, and over the next century a network of Catholic schools developed across the country.



1877

After the withdrawal of government assistance to Catholic schools in the 1877 Sduration Act, bishops persuaded various religious orders from European Catholic countries to eatablish and staff schools in Acteuran New Zealand.



1900

By 1900 Catholic schools were staffed almost exclusively by members of Religious congregations, who gave their lives to this service, supported by their parish and the local community.



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1950

By the late 1980s the impact of the post war beby boom, inflation and the need to employ more lay teachers placed ever increasing pressure on the system. State Aid was needed urgently if the Catholic school system was to survive.



1975

In 1975 the Private Schools Conditional Integration Authors seemed by the New Zealand Parliament. This Act created a partnership between the State and the Church Integrating private schools into the state system in such a way as to preserve and safeguard their special character.



1983

By 1983 all Catholic schools were integrated, their running costs being met on the same basis as state schools.



2021

We have 65,900 students in Catholic Schools. We have 187 primary schools and 48 secondary schools

An Environmentally Sustainable Lifestyle: That everyone might make choices which promote a simple and sustainable lifestyle.



Last week was **Social Justice Week**. This year Social Justice Week highlighted the Beatitudes from Matthew 5:1-12. The theme was 'A Culture of Encounter: Be the Church'. 
"Blessed are those who remain faithful while enduring evils inflicted on them by others and forgive them from their heart."
