From the Principals Desk...

Kia Ora Koutou. Our Year 6 We will not request or seek children headed out to the Vertical evidence of vaccination where: Horizons camp yesterday • Parents/caregivers are dropping

- Parents/caregivers are dropping off, picking up, or settling children at a school.
- Parents or caregivers are attending meetings or events on site (for example, parent-teacher interviews)
- The general public are using school facilities after hours (for example, playground, school pool)

We will need you to provide evidence (to the school Principal) that you have received your first vaccination dose prior to the 15th November and will be fully vaccinated by 1st January 2022.

- If you are volunteering during a school event.
- If you are coaching a school team.
- If you are volunteering and providing parent help at school.
- If you are volunteering as parent help on camp.
- If you are providing transport to a school event.

Thank you to all our parent volunteers who have over the end of last week and this week provided a copy of your vaccination status.

In the meantime we also ask our parents to continue following our Level 2 guidelines which include...

- Wearing a face mask while on school grounds
- Signing in through our covid tracer app
- Staying at home of you are unwell
- Social distancing while waiting to collect children

Teacher Only Day: We have scheduled our final teacher only day for 2021 to take place on NEXT Friday 26th November. **School will be closed next Friday.**

End of Year Graduation: We have considered our end of year graduation for 2021. It would appear that we will remain at alert level 2 through till the end of the year. With this in mind we are currently planning the following. Year 6 children and whanau will only be permitted to attend.

- Year 6 children will be split into two groups of 20 alphabetically. Each family will be allowed to have two adults present at the graduation.
- Adults attending will be seated according to a plan and will need to follow Level 2 guidelines by wearing face masks, and distancing 2 m between families.
- The graduation will be significantly modified to allow children to receive their leaving certificates and crosses. Families leaving SJB will receive their leaving rose.
- We will either live stream or record the graduation and parts of it will be pre recorded.
- The date has been set as Wednesday 15th December and times of 6:00pm and 6:45pm.

More details will be shared with our Year 6 whanau as we confirm the revised format.

St John Bosco Pool Keys: We will be offering school pool keys to the community once again. The cost will be \$65 which will need to be paid before the collection of a key (a \$15 bond will be returned on return of the key at the end of the season). All key holders will sign the schools user agreement and rules prior to keys being given.

We will let you know via the newsletter and our school app when we are set to distribute keys.

Those using the pool will be asked to follow our Level 2 protocols. This year the Community Group will place the names of all 2020 Key holders into a hat and draw the names of two families, who will in return be given a key free of charge.

We are also looking for people who would be interested in helping maintain the pool over the holiday period. If you could help please let me know.

Sunday 21st November Feast of Christ the King of the Universe

The last Sunday in Ordinary Time each year is the Feast of Christ the King. This feast reminds us that in time Christ will be the King of his kingdom of justice, peace and love on earth and we have helped to build this by living as he lived, by being of service to others as part of our ordinary lives.

Pope Pius XI instituted The Feast of Christ the King in 1925 for the universal church in his encyclical Quas Primas. At the time of Quas Primas, many Christians (including Catholics) began to doubt Christ's authority and existence, as well as the Church's power to continue Christ's authority.

When we celebrate Christ as King, we are not celebrating an oppressive ruler, but one willing to die for humanity and whose "loving-kindness endures forever." Christ is the king that gives us true freedom, freedom in Him. Thus we must never forget that Christ radically redefined and transformed the concept of kingship.

Synod 2021-2023 - For a synodal Church: communion, participation and mission.

In this synodal process three dimensions are profoundly interrelated. They are:

Communion - diverse people gathered together in one faith. It is Christ who reconciles us to the Father and unites us with each other in the Holy Spirit.

Participation - All of us belong to the People of God; laity, consecrated and ordained, all are qualified and called to participate together to pray, listen, analyse, dialogue and discern on making pastoral decisions that serve God's will.

Mission - We are called to evangelise, never be centered on ourselves. We are called to bear witness to the love of God for the whole human family.
