

Term 4 Week 7

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It's week 7 and I'm pondering that we only have only 10 more days of schooling to go for the year. Uncertainty of how moving to a traffic light system might affect our last few weeks has been worked through and we now have a plan through till the end of the year. This is the first week of advent. Our advent wreath blessing last week was quite special for the school. Mrs Mehana also gave a great explanation in relation to the significance and meaning of the wreath. I love this time of the year and the excitement I see growing on the children's faces, the excitement I see as children work on and complete advent activities and witnessing the confidence that they have grown over the year.

We will be releasing our final reporting of children's progress for the year on Monday 13th December as well as sending families details about stationery and classes for 2022.

Covid Traffic Light System update and what it means for SJB: On Monday 29 November, Cabinet met to determine which colour of the traffic light system different parts of the country would move into.

We now know that we will move into the orange traffic light as a region and that the Government will not yet be placing any region into the Green setting. However it will be different for us at school until January 1st 2022. The Ministers have agreed that all schools will retain their existing COVID-19 settings until the end of the 2021 calendar year. This means we will follow our Alert level two guidelines and remain with our current restrictions. There will be no changes to events meaning we are still unable to have parents gather onsite for school events such as assemblies, sports days etc...

We continue to ask families to

- sign in via our covid QR code
- wear face masks when onsite
- stay away if sick and keep children home who are unwell
- class helpers and volunteers will need to share their vaccination status and have had at least one dose prior to November 15th
- school events such as athletics days etc will continue to be in school events only with no parents.

What will the traffic lights look like for us in 2022...

- At all settings of the framework
- Schools will be open with students and staff onsite.
- The same public health measures you are very familiar with remain in place:
- good hygiene and cleaning
- contact tracing systems in place
- vaccination requirements for workers (paid and unpaid), and all eligible people encouraged to be vaccinated
- if you are sick, you must stay home and get tested

- good ventilation.
- Contact tracing and case management will continue to be very important.
- There **will not be** a physical distancing requirement at any CPF setting, but at Red, keeping a one metre is recommended between different groups when inside and where practicable.
- Face coverings on school transport will align with requirements for public transport at every CPF setting (we anticipate this will be required for ages 12 and above at Orange and Red).
- Similarly, events and activities not related to the curriculum will need to align with requirements for the relevant settings in the CPF, as will offsite curriculum-related activities.
