> We will continue to keep focused on preventing spread. At the same time we are on tender hooks as our turn will come. I continue to be so proud of our senior children who are wearing masks daily. It is not easy, yet they do so without any fuss.

There have been some changes to guidelines for schools. The key changes are as follows:

COVID-19 Protection Framework, My Vaccine Pass and vaccination mandates

- The removal of vaccination mandates for education workers will take effect from 11.59pm Monday 4 April.
- · On the same date, removal of the My Vaccine Pass from the COVID-19 Protection Framework (traffic light system). We will no longer require to monitor volunteer vaccine passes.
- There is no longer a requirement to display QR code posters; we will maintain other regular processes, and encourage visitors to sign in at our school office. This QR code system may need to return if case numbers rise.

Red Traffic Light

- There is no change to masks in education settings from the existing Red setting. Medicalgrade masks remain a requirement for staff working indoors with children and young people in Years 4-13.
- For all New Zealanders, including school settings, masks will not be required outdoors. We are encouraging our families to continue to do so. We believe that this has been a key measure to keep our staff safe and our school open.
- · Capacity limits will be removed for outdoor events and activities allowing families to attend any outdoor event.
- · Indoor capacity limits for extra-curricular activities increase to 200 people, or a maximum capacity based on

the maximum number of people who could occupy the space if each person was one metre apart (whichever is When and if we lower). return to assemblies it will be highly likely that parents will still not be able to attend.

We will continue to maintain our split morning tea and lunch breaks through till the end of term 1. We will return to our normal whole school break times in term 2.

In the meantime we ask that you continue to:

- · Wear masks on site
- · Keep children home if they are unwell
- · Maintain good hand hygiene practices
- · Ventilate when and where you can.
