Welcome: I would like to welcome the following new students to St John Bosco School and their families to our School Community:

Our first few days back at school have been lovely. Our children are really settled and this has made for a great start.

Being within the Orange Level we were also able to come together Monday afternoon as a school to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ and celebrate that he is alive in each and everyone of us. Our goal this term is to live our lives alongside his teachings and values. Below are a few very quick reminders and updates.

As we are working under Orange guidelines we have moved back to whole school breaks. We have also modified our break times slightly, meaning morning tea will run from 10:30 - 11:00am and lunch will run from 12:40 - 1:30pm.

We are encouraging children in Year 4-6 to wear masks when

in class. We are asking children to wear masks in Year 4-6 when attending assemblies or large indoor gatherings. Staff in Year 4-6 will continue to wear masks in class and all staff will continue to wear masks when in close contact with community members.

Last term we worked hard to keep classes informed of positive cases of Covid when they happened. This term I'll focus more on a weekly update for the school. household it would be great if you could inform us.

Once again I ask parents, supporters and children representing our school to be good sports, to encourage, include and support all team members in the game, to respect all opposition teams with kind words and actions, to be respectful, thankful and appreciative of game officials and their coaches. 
### THE POPE'S PRAYER INTENTION MAY 2022 FAITH FILLED YOUNG PEOPLE

### YOU COULD ASK YOUR CHILD:

- What do you know about the Holy Spirit working in
- Do you know any of the titles or symbols of the Holy Sprit in the bible? (flame, wind, dove etc.)
  - When is a time that you have felt the Holy Spirit working in you to make a good choice or to use courage?
- When you get older, what kind of job would you like to do and how do you think the Holy Spirit might work through you?
- Can you show me the sign of the cross saying the three parts of the Trinity?

"In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Some children may even be able to say it in a different language!)

### YOU CAN SUPPORT YOUR CHILD WITH THEIR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION BY:

- Walking in the wind and remembering how it is like the Holy Spirit.

(You cannot see it but you can feel it and see the effects of it.)

- Talking about the fruits of the Holy Spirit and how you can use them at home and school. (Galatians 4:22-25)
- Encourage them to let the Holy Spirit work through them to make good choices and reach out to others.


Be sure to tell then when you notice the Holy Spirit working in them when they show love, patience, kindness etc.

**Dear Parents and Caregivers** 

The University of Canterbury is offering your child the opportunity to participate in the KIWI English, Mathematics and Science competitions. These competitions take place annually and are designed by New Zealand teachers for New Zealand students based on the New Zealand Curriculum. The competitions are open to all Year 5-10 students in English, Mathematics and Science. Students can enter in one or more subjects. The competition will provide parents/caregivers with an Individual Pupil Report of a student's performance. The supervised online tests will take place in the last 3 weeks of Term 2 and the first week of Term 3.

All participating students will receive a certificate and a prize will be awarded to the top student nationally in each competition.

NOTE: Our policy is **not** to release test papers. The tests are provided primarily as a competition and not as a teaching resource.
