#### THE POPE'S PRAYER INTENTION MAY 2022 FAITH FILLED YOUNG PEOPLE

We pray for all young people, called to live life to the fullest; may they see in Mary's life the way to listen, the depth of discernment, the courage that faith generates, and the dedication to service.

#### May - The Month of Mary

The Blessed Virgin Mary is a beautiful, beloved, essential and pervasive figure in Christian life and in the Church's calendar. She has been since the early days of the Church. In the Catholic Church the month of May is Mary's month. It's the month we honor Blessed Mary as the Mother of Jesus and our Heavenly Mother. Historians aren't exactly sure why May was chosen to honor Mary, but many believe that May being the month when spring is in full bloom (in Europe) has a lot to do with it. May is the height of spring—gardens. They are alive with blooming flowers and trees are filling their branches with leaves. This new beginning and new birth in nature reminds us of the life Mary gave to Jesus. Without Mary giving birth to Jesus, all the events that followed: Jesus' life, death, and resurrection wouldn't have happened. So, it's believed that May (when nature is showing signs of life) is the ideal month to honor the woman who gave life to our Saviour.

#### Our Lady Help of Christians Feast: 24th May

Feast days dedicated to Mary are as varied as the cultures of the world, with each having special traditions, customs, and habits of piety. Tuesday 24th May is the feast day of Our Lady Help of Christians. We observe it here in Aotearoa as a memorial. It dates back to the sixteenth century. On Tuesday we will be attending morning mass at 9am with the Parish to celebrate the Feast of Our Lady Help of Christians, whom our church is named after. You may like to include our Lady in your family prayers this week and this month of May.



### FAITH FACT

#### Saturday 14 May was the feast of St Matthias, the apostle.

The first act of the apostles after the Ascension of Jesus was to find a replacement for Judas. With all the questions, doubts, and dangers facing them, they chose to focus their attention on finding a twelfth apostle. Why was this important? Twelve was a very important number to the Chosen People: twelve was the number of the twelve tribes of Israel. If the new Israel was to come from the disciples of Jesus, a twelfth apostle was needed. Peter had one criterion, that, like Andrew, James, John, and himself, the new apostle be someone who had been a disciple from the very beginning, from his baptism by John until the Ascension. Matthew (Matthias) was the person who was chosen.

The Preparation programme will begin in June. Karen, the Young Families Minister for our Parish will be teaching the programme during school time. Parents are required to attend the parent session to be held next week Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> May at St Joseph's Church Hall at 7pm.


