From the Principals Desk... On Tuesday we celebrated Our

mother church of his congregation at Turin on June 9, 1868. So, you can see that there is also an incredibly significant and spiritual link between St John Bosco and Our Lady Help of Christians and it's not by chance that they stand beside each other here in Aotearoa.

The story continues. I have been able to identify descendants of the Cameron family June Kissick, Noeline McSweeny and their brother Merv Whittle. They regularly attend mass at Our Lady and have been able to confirm my research. But even better Isla and Ellie Bellringer, great, great, great granddaughters of Agnes and Thomas Cameron are currently attending St John Bosco School.

Like I mentioned before. A very brief overview of the history, with a lot more detail not included...

We have had another week of high absences this week related to covid and other bugs. An average of 50 children away each day. Brent is still sanitising work spaces daily and we are encouraging regular hand sanatising and wearing of masks when we come together in large groups. Thank you for keeping children home who are unwell.

We have had a few local schools visiting us over the past weeks, looking at our curriculum, learning spaces and also discussing our strategic planning and visioning of the school. Next week we have a group of Manawatu Principals visiting to look at our culturally responsive localised curriculum. It's always a privilege to share our story with other schools and is a pat on the back to our teachers also.

Interschool sports: I would like to raise your interests to a change of date for our first exchange against Puketapu School. This has now changed to 15th June. So the dates are: Puketapu School 15th June at SJB

Winter uniform: We are now asking that students are in their winter uniform. This includes wearing black shoes and navy socks (girls do have an option of white socks). I do ask that the shoes are completely black and you avoid white soles. Students are able to wear any jacket to school. But once in class jackets are not to be worn

Rippa Rugby: We have entered 4 teams into the Tukupa Rippa Rugby competition. This will be held on 9th June. Children selected for these teams should have received a notice with further details. We wish them well.

Sunday School Lead Parish Mass: With the movement to Orange level we are in a position to move back to holding our School lead Mass. This has been booked for 19th June 10:30 a.m. At this stage I fully support families' decisions on whether they will or will not attend. I will be asking that families who do attend wear facemasks as a precaution. Obviously I would love you all to attend but at the same time I am wavering on a cautious approach.

Teacher Only Day: Our next teacher only day has been booked for Week 7 on Friday 17th June. School will be closed on this day for children.

Scholastic Bookfair: Our BookFair closes today Friday 27th May at 3:30p.m. Thank you to the man families that visited our book fair this year. The school has already received \$120 worth of free books donated by Scholastics and we will also receive 30% of the total sum of books sold. This should be around \$1000.00 and further money we can use to purchase new books for our library.

ASB lifesaver course: Ms Lynskey has organised for every class to work through the ASB Lifesaver course. This will take place 9th-14th June. All classes have been allocated a space. I look forward to the children coming home and sharing their learnings with you.

After School Care: Mrs Cherie Smith has resigned from her manager's position in our After School Care programme. Cherie has been a part of our staff for 7 years as a teacher aide and also running our ASC program and it will be sad to say goodbye. Her last day will be Friday 17th June.

THE POPE'S PRAYER INTENTION MAY 2022 FAITH FILLED YOUNG PEOPLE

We pray for all young people, called to live life to the fullest; may they see in Mary's life the way to listen, the depth of discernment, the courage that faith generates, and the dedication to service.

The Ascension of Our Lord: The Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord is observed this Sunday the 29th May. It is observed 40 days after Easter Sunday. These 40 days go back to the passage we can find in the Acts of the Apostles, written by Luke: "For forty days after Jesus' death he appeared to them many times in ways that proved beyond doubt that he was alive. They saw him, and he talked with them about the Kingdom of God." (Acts 1:3).

The last words Jesus spoke before he ascended into heaven were "But you will receive power, when the Holy Spirit has come upon you: and you shall be my witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and even to the remotest parts of the earth" (Acts 1:18). This promise came true on Pentecost which we celebrate the next Sunday.

The Ascension then marks the end of Jesus' special appearances - but it does not mean the end of his appearance for good. The ascension signifies that Christ completed his work on Earth and allowed him to prepare a place for his followers in heaven.


