From the Principals Desk...

Welcome: I would like to welcome Luca Anamani to room Puriri and his parents Kate and Vilo to our school community.

It seems that we may have worked our way through a period of higher than normal rates of illness. This week we have had a significantly reduced number of children absent from school. We are hopeful that we may now make our way through the remainder of the term with minimal disruption.

On Wednesday we held our first full school assembly indoors since early August 2021. It was really hard to believe that this was only Mr Stirling's 2nd full school assembly since arriving at SJB. We finally had a chance to welcome 28 new students to our school who have begun since the start of the year.

This week 25 of our students will begin their sacramental programme of reconciliation. We ask you to pray for these students as they enter into a deeper connection with their faith. I also ask that the Holy Spirit will guide them in their thoughts, actions and words during and following their lessons.

The Board of Trustees and I have this week submitted a plan to the Palmerston North Diocese, that will hopefully towards the end of this year or early 2023, see our main netball court covered in artificial turf, as well as a large outdoor all weather learning shelter added to the courtyard outside Rooms Nikau and Horoeka. Covid has meant that the starting of these projects has been pushed out a little further than we had initially planned. But they are now back on the cards.

We seem to go through phases of having lots of school uniform left at school. We try really hard to get this back to its owners but have recently noticed a lot of unnamed uniform. Some of it is brand new. Some pieces

Special Character Review: During week 9 (June 28th-30th) we will undergo our Special Character Review. A team of reviewers from our Catholic Diocese in Palmerston North will spend time reviewing the many special character aspects of our school curriculum, policy, teaching programmes, enrolment and the many ways we uphold and maintain the special Catholic character of our school. This is a chance for us to celebrate the hard work and affirm that the special character of our school is in great spirit.

Teacher Only Day: Our next teacher only day has been booked for Week 7 on Friday 17th June. School will be closed on this day for children.

We sold approximately \$4500.00 worth of books and in return the school has received a Scholastic Books credit of \$1500.00 that we can use to purchase books for our library. 
THE POPE'S PRAYER INTENTION JUNE 2022 FAMILIES


Te Wairua Tapu is God working in and through us to help us to live and be like Jesus.
