Puanga (Matariki): This weekend will see the first national recognition, celebration and observance of Matariki. The rise of Puanga (Matariki) in the winter skies above Aotearoa is an important time in the Māori calendar, as it signifies the start of the Māori new year. While other iwi throughout Aotearoa tend to celebrate Matariki, Taranaki iwi see Puanga as the star to mark the new year. Historically, new year celebrations provided the opportunity for whanau to come together to remember those that are no longer with us and have passed on during the year, acknowledge the year gone by and to prepare, plan and set goals for the year ahead. Currently in the early morning due to the nature of the horizon and the timing of the sun rising Matariki is not visible in Taranaki. Instead the Star that we see shining brightly in the morning sky and acknowledge is Puanga. The term Puanga translates into abundance of food. During this time historically and by the beginning of winter, harvests had occurred and food stores were plentiful. People shared their harvests and began to prepare their gardens for a new year of planting and cultivating.

Historically as a school we have celebrated Puanga for many years. This has taken many forms including community hangi, making soup, arts and crafts, sharing breakfast and learning about Puanga. I've included a link here that you may like to look at. This is our community Puanga hangi in 2018 Link. Below are the details related to our Puanga celebration in 2022.

I really do hope that your whanau spend some time remembering special people in your lives that have passed on, reflecting on the year that has been and also take the opportunity to discuss some plans, goals and aspirations for the new year ahead.

Interschool Sports: We have had two interschool exchanges in the past weeks. Our first saw us host Puketapu School and on Tuesday Waitara East hosted us. These exchanges have included our Year 5 / 6 Netball A & B teams and also our interschool football, rugby and chess teams.
