Dear Parents, Caregivers and friends of the school.

I would like to start by welcoming the following new tamariki and families who have joined our St John Bosco School Community recently:

Nau mai haere mai ki te kura o Hato Hoani Paukau - St John Bosco School. May God bless you on your educational journey with us. We will nurture and grow your children and enable them to be the best version of themselves everyday on their journey to reaching their full potential.

We recently presented data to our school board on our mid year writing achievement. Our mid year writing data is generated by the goals children have achieved and these goals are drawn from the New Zealand curriculum. As of the 14th of July, we have 90% of our children achieving at or beyond the curriculum expectation. 92% of our girls are at or beyond the expected curriculum level while 88 % of our boys are. For our Maori students we 87% of students working at or beyond expectation. Our children work hard, our staff work very hard and I know our families are committed to homework and creating the foundations for academic success so we should be proud of the achievement level we have.

We absolutely loved Grandparents (& special friends) Day. What an amazing turnout. It was neat seeing so many 'old friends' catch up after too. 'Community building' is done on many levels and to have "Little Angels" pre school playgroup in the foyer on a Monday and Grandparents day mass on the Wednesday is a great example of this.

I want to draw your attention to the "Our Kids Online" information evening. Our community group is generously funding this so that tickets are free for St John Bosco families. Please return the favour by turning up. We currently have over 180 people indicate that they will attend. It takes a community to raise a child and it takes a community who aware and committed to the same ideals to keep our children safe online. The session is presented by Rob Cope. He is knowledgeable, very funny and will provide us all with a framework to ensure we all have a plan for social media and phones before our children reach intermediate when we won't win the battle!







Messages from the Parish

THE FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION OF OUR LADY is a Holy Day of Obligation and celebrated on August 15. It commemorates the belief that Mary, the Mother of Jesus, was taken body and soul into heaven at the end of her earthly life.

Early Christian traditions and writings reference the Assumption, and by the 8th century, it was widely celebrated. The doctrine was formally declared a dogma by Pope Pius XII in 1950. In New Zealand, apart from all Sundays throughout the year, there are two additional



Holy Days of Obligation: Christmas and the Feast of the Assumption. People are asked to attend Mass on these days. The Feast of the Assumption is also the Patronal Feast day of New Zealand.

The Assumption of Our Lady continues to be a source of inspiration and devotion for Catholics, encouraging us to look to Mary as a model of faith and a powerful advocate in heaven. Please see the newsletter timetable for all opportunities to attend Mass this Thursday - 15 August.

Pope Francis has appointed Archbishop Gábor Pintér as the new Apostolic Nuncio to Aotearoa New Zealand. Archbishop Pintér – who will also serve as Apostolic Delegate to the Pacific Ocean – succeeds Archbishop Novatus Rugambwa, who returned to Rome in March after suffering a stroke last October.


