FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK...

Dear Parents, Caregivers and friends of the school.

Nau mai haere mai ki te kura o Hato Hoani Paukau - St John Bosco School. May God bless you on your educational journey with us. We will nurture and grow your children and enable them to be the best version of themselves everyday on their journey to reaching their full potential.

I want to start by making a giant, heartfelt thank you to those that came to the "Our Kids Online" presentation with Rob Cope last night. It was a great turn out. It was shocking, confronting and, in the end, motivating. I hope those of us who attended will start a shared standard for the internet, phones and social media that will spread throughout our community and become the dominant value.

I want to thank our Community Fundraising Group for enabling it to happen - this was a true community service. Not only to ensure it was at no cost to our community but that we are all able to be this informed about what is probably the greatest challenge facing our children and us as parents.

One of the key messages was that it takes a community to protect our children from the dangers of unfiltered access to the internet/social media and that too many of our homes do not have enough or even any restrictions in place. Rob was adamant that some variation of the following conversation must be part of any play date set up:

"Before my child comes to yours to play I need to know if you have filters on your internet or whether they will have unrestricted access to the internet"

So lets do it. It takes a village to protect our children on the street/out in public and it takes a village to do it online.

Based on what I learned from last night's talk I will never allow my children to go to somebody else's house without a guarantee of some kind of proper internet/social media restriction and monitoring.

It was also very clear that absolutely no St John Bosco children should have accounts with the likes of snapchat, tik tok or instagram.

If there is enough interest, we can look at playing the recording to parents/guardians/grandparents one day after school.

I know that was all pretty direct, but the social media thing is one of the greatest challenges to our children's wellbeing so we need to be proactive and have rules and expectations in place well before they leave for intermediate.
