
### THE POPE'S PRAYER INTENTION September 2024 For the cry of the Earth:






# 19th of September the anniversary of women in New Zealand winning the right to vote

God, may women across the globe continue to be empowered, knowing the love you offer.



### 27<sup>th</sup> September is the Feast Day of St Vincent de Paul

Since the early 1900's, young people have been involved with the work of the St Vincent de Paul Society in New Zealand.

The Society was founded by seven people, most of whom were teenagers. The object of having a youth arm of the Society that caters for people from age about 11 to 30ish is to help them to realise that there are people in society in need, and to encourage them to help those people. They are also encouraged to realise that the reason Vincentians help people is not just because they feel good doing this work, but because of the Gospel message to love your neighbour as yourself. Something to think and pray about during these holidays.









