Thank you to Jo Sisifa who managed the team.










# Term 2 Sports



YCC DAY - We will hold our YCC mufti day on Thursday 4th July



### Suzanne Aubert Birthday 19th June


Suzanne Aubert: New Zealand's first potential Saint. In 1889 Suzanne opened St Joseph's Home to nurse those suffering from incurable diseases – mainly older men with no family. She also had a nursery for babies and children, to care for disabled children and babies born to unmarried mothers or parents who were unable to provide for them as a result of poverty and the soup kitchen.

Mother Aubert created these facilities to support the impoverished of all faiths. When Mother Aubert died aged 91 in 1926, she was a highly respected and beloved figure. Her funeral on 5 October was widely reported as the largest ever accorded a woman in New Zealand. In 2016, Pope Francis declared Mother Aubert 'Venerable', an important milestone on the journey to a person being declared a saint.



#### 23rd June Day of Prayer for Refugees & Migrants

Pope Francis Message for Refugees & Migrants (25 September 2022) God's plan is essentially inclusive and gives priority to those living on the existential peripheries. Among them are many migrants and refugees, displaced persons, and victims of trafficking. The Kingdom of God is to be built with them, for without them it would not be the Kingdom that God wants. The inclusion of those most vulnerable is the necessary condition for full citizenship in God's Kingdom.



### 24th June The NATIVITY of ST JOHN THE BAPTIST

John the Baptist was the son of Elizabeth who Mary visited when she was pregnant with Jesus. John was a miracle baby since his parents were too old to have children. An angel appeared to John's father in the temple and told him that John would be born. John's nativity is a very real and beautiful story. It is a story of hope.

Fr Thong left Vietnam 13 years ago because of political issues. In his vote of thanks he said that, after giving a presentation at the White House about the freedom of religious in Vietnam, he recognised that "true freedom" is only found in Jesus Christ. For that he wanted to become a Priest for the salvation of souls.




